We are to serve the Lord and teach our children to serve the Lord. My father made sure we were in Sunday school, Sunday morning and evening service, and Wednesday prayer meeting. If there were evangelistic meetings or missions conference, we attended every service. My father made sure we had devotions, went to Bible Camp, had the right friends, the right music, and he encouraged us to go to Bible college.

There are three simple truths in Joshua 24:15. 1) It is not evil or disagreeable to serve the Lord. No matter what is going on in the world, it is always reasonable to serve the Lord. 2) It is evil to serve false gods. We are to stop loving the world system: drinking, smoking, gambling, pornography, fornication, cohabiting, abortions, gay marriage, swearing, complaining, television, Facebook, pride, jealousy, covetousness, gossip, rebellion, bitterness and hate. 3) We are to serve the Lord. It is not easy to deny self, mortify the flesh and take up His cross. Joshua made the choice for them to serve the Lord. This was Joshua's RESOLUTION toward the end of his life. Those bound for heaven must be willing to swim against the stream of culture.

Every father needs to promote Christian education because a child develops security when the home, church and school all agree. A truly Christian school will teach saving faith, obedience to the Word, the fear of God, holy living, glorification of God, doing our best and worshipping of God.

Ps. 3:3, "But thou, O LORD, art a shield for me; my glory, and the lifter up of mine head."

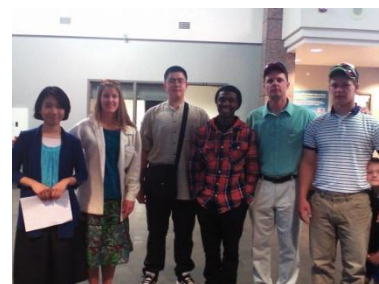
