III. PARENTS NEED TO BE RESPONSIBLE IN GIVING THEIR CHILDREN A CHRISTIAN WORLDVIEW THAT IS ROOTED IN THE BELIEF THAT HUMANS ARE CREATED IN THE IMAGE OF GOD AND THEREFORE HAVE GREAT DIGNITY AND VALUE.

- A. A Christian worldview is based on TRUTH, which is "absolute fact based on an unchanging standard"; and Jesus said, "I am the way the TRUTH and the life." Therefore man needs to come to a place in his life where he admits he is a sinner. Man has a choice: to pay for his sin by going to hell, or accepting the free gift of eternal life and the perfect righteousness of Christ, and then experience the transforming power of God. John 3:36, "He that believeth on the Son hath everlasting life: and he that believeth not the Son shall not see life; but the wrath of God abideth on him."
- B. A Christian worldview encourages intellectual development. Erasmus, a sixteenth century Dutch scholar, once said, "All studies, philosophies, rhetoric are

followed for this one object, that we may know Christ and honor Him. This is the end of all learning and eloquence." 1Sam. 16:18, "Then answered one of the servants, and said, Behold, I have seen a son of Jesse the Bethlehemite, that is cunning in playing, and a mighty valiant man, and a man of war, and prudent in matters (speech), and a comely person, and the LORD is with him."

- C. A Christian worldview involves Christian Educators. Pollster George Barna states that "the implication of the research findings is clear: Anyone who wishes to have significant influence on the development of a person's moral and spiritual foundations had better exert that influence while the person is still open-minded and impressionable – in other words, while the person is still young." Ps 1:1, "Blessed is the man that walketh not in the counsel of the ungodly (wicked), nor standeth in the way of sinners, nor sitteth in the seat of the scornful."
- D. A CHRISTIAN WORLDVIEW DEMANDS THE TEACHER TO HELP THE STUDENT REACH HIS POTENTIAL IN CHRIST. The teacher has the responsibility to help students overcome obstructions to their spiritual and academic success. With a steady, guiding hand, the Christian school teacher enables students to appreciate, value, and fully develop their uniqueness in Christ. 1John 2:15, "Love not the world, neither the things that are in the world. If any man love the world, the love of the Father is not in him. 16 For all that is in the world, the lust of the flesh, and the lust of the eyes, and the pride of life, is not of the Father, but is of the world. 17 And the world passeth away, and the lust thereof: but he that doeth the will of God abideth for ever."
